**Retraction of Earlier Article and Letter to Editor on Thought Field Therapy**

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10 It has come to my attention that an anonymous supporter of Thought Field Therapy  
11 (TFT) has attempted, in an internet encyclopedia Wikipedia article on TFT to reference  
12 and quote from a Letter to the Editor I published in 1998 in response to Wayne Hooke's  
13 critique of Thought Field Therapy (Hooke, 1998; Pignotti, 1998). Although I have  
14 corrected this outdated, misleading representation of my views on TFT and have  
15 publications in other journals stating my reversal of position on Thought Field Therapy  
16 (Pignotti, 2004, 2005a, 2005b, 2005c, 2007), given that I have published highly favorable  
17 opinions on TFT for this journal in the past (Pignotti, 1998; 2000) that some TFT  
18 supporters still choose to cite without noting my change in views, I wanted to write an  
19 official statement for *Traumatology* to make present views and research known. Due to a  
20 controlled study I conducted and subsequently published on Thought Field Therapy  
21 Voice Technology (Pignotti, 2005c) which resulted in my also rethinking my position on  
22 other aspects of TFT, I no longer endorse TFT and am currently in agreement with the  
23 review written by Hooke. I hereby retract what I wrote in my past articles for this journal  
24 (Pignotti 1998; 2000). For details on my reasons for this, see references provided below.
