1. Aldwin, C.M. (2007). *Stress, coping, and development: An integrative perspective* (2<sup>nd</sup> ed.). New York, NY: The Guilford Press. (357 pp, \$38.00 hb, ISBN: 1-57230-840-0).

This book examines “the nature of psychosocial stress, strategies individuals use to cope with it, and the implications for adaptation and health across the lifespan.” The sixteen chapters begin with introducing stress and stress research and then discuss coping.

Chapters focused on specific interests are Chapter 10: *Coping and Mental Health*, Chapter 11: *Coping and Physical Health*, Chapter 12: *Coping with Traumatic Stress*, Chapter 13: *Sociocultural Aspects of Coping*, and Chapter 14: *Developmental Studies of Coping*.

2. Johnson, H. (2007). *Tragic redemption: Healing the guilt and shame*. Austin, TX: LangMarc Publishing. (171 pp, ISBN: 1880292777).

This work is a personal account of how God helped the author work through the shame and guilt of killing a car passenger. Fifteen chapters describe the author’s “downward spiral” (p. 12) and eventual redemption. Dr. Stephen Seamands provides the foreword.

3. Pargament, K.I. (2007). *Spiritually integrated psychotherapy: Understanding and addressing the sacred*. New York, NY: Guilford Publications. (345 pp, \$38.00 hb, ISBN: 1-57230-844-3).

4. Pryce, J.G., Shackelford, K.K., & Pryce, D.H. (2007). *Secondary Traumatic Stress and the child welfare professional*. Chicago, IL: Lyceum Books, Inc. (200 pp, \$29.95 pb, ISBN: 978-1-933478-05-0).

This book describes STS in child welfare work, provides tools to help those entering child welfare work identify practical interventions to cope with STS, and suggests how educators can help prevent dropout later. The book has seven chapters. There is an online manual available.

5. Volkman, V.R. (Ed). (2006). *Traumatic Incident Reduction and Critical Incident Stress Management: A synergistic approach*. Ann Arbor, MI: Loving Healing Press. (107 pp, ISBN: 978-1-932690-29-3).

This is the first book in the TIR Application Series (Series Editor: Robert Rich). This particular book has six chapters. Four chapters deal specifically with TIR and CISM/CISD. Chapter 5: *CISM, TIR, and Workplace Crime*, and Chapter 6: *Traumatology on the Front Lines* are special interests. Appendix A is a question and
